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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

• Introduction

Samata Shikshan Sanstha, Pune is a registered social service agency established in 1972 under the leadership of Prof. Vilas Wagh with a very broad vision to serve the down-trodden and weaker sections of the society. Since its inception, it has been rendering social service to the society through a number of programmes and activities such as Ashram Schools, Hostel for poor girls and boys and children's homes etc.

The organization functions on a strong conviction that people can make a difference in the lives of many of those who are less fortunate fellow beings of the society. In response to the problems of the people and needs of the area, **Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work was started by Samata Shikshan Sanstha in the year 1995-96 at Morane (Nakane) Tal & Dist Dhule.**

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work is affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon and financially supported by Department of Social Welfare, Government of Maharashtra . The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore constituted by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, has accredited the college with CGPA 2.52 on four point scale at B grade in June 2015 ISO Accreditation . The College is registered under 12(B) Act of the University Grants Commission, The College is located on Dhule – Sakri Road at Morane about 7 kms from the main city and situated in the premises having about 3.00 acres of land. It has its own library and reading room with more than 9830 books, journals and magazines on the subjects related to social work.

The College imparts training in social work both at undergraduate as well as post-graduate levels, leading to three year **Bachelor's of Social Work (BSW) and Two Years Master's of Social Work (MSW)** courses respectively. Both the Courses are generic in nature but likely to have one or two more specializations so as to prepare the students to accept the challenges and take up the responsibilities of working with people having different problems and areas having their own needs with holistic and participative approach. The whole process of social work education and training followed by the College of social work includes class- room teaching of theory subjects, field work practice and practical research in respective areas and fields. The Social Work training also emphasizes on exposure of students to the field realities and socio-economic conditions of the people living in rural, tribal and urban areas. Students are also involved in regular well scheduled individual conferences, group discussion, paper presentation, seminars, workshops, rural camps and study tours etc.

The faculty comprises of well qualified and experienced teachers in their respective fields. Both, teaching and non-teaching staff of the College work as a team having close and personal touch with the students and day to day functioning of the College. The students and staff are involved in various academic and extra curricular activities of the College.

● **B.S.W. Course :-** For B.S.W. degree, candidates who have passed H.S.C. examination (higher Secondary Certificate Examination) of the Maharashtra State Board of Higher Secondary Education, Pune or its equivalent Certificate will be eligible to obtain Admission. B.S.W. Course admission will be based on the H.S.C. percentage. Merit list will follow reservation rules.

Head of Passing :

The Following shall be separate heads of passing:

- a) Written Theory Papers.
- b) Field Work
- c) Research Dissertation
- d) Viva – Voce

Failure in any one of the heads shall be considered as a failure at the BSW course.

Rules of ATKT:-

Students must pass in every 3 theory courses in each semester out of 5 courses to avail of the benefit of ATKT for the next semester. A student shall be allowed to keep term of semester II, III, up to IV the semester and it should be clear all head of passing before admitting in the third year. A student failing in field work at any semester shall not get the benefit of ATKT including theory papers and will have to repeat the entire semester.

Written Theory Papers:-

Semester wise examination for each theory paper of 60 marks will be conducted by the University at the end of each semester and 40 marks will be internal assessment by the college at the end of each semester. The students who have failed in any subject of the semesters may appear for University Examination to be held in the next semester.

Field Work :-

Each student is required to complete 15 hours of field work during two days a week in the organization where he is placed for his field work. Field work of each student will be supervised by the faculty supervisor. Field work will be evaluated internally by the college for 100 marks in each semester. Each student will be required to secure 50% marks to pass in field work in each semester. In case the student fails in field work, he/she shall have to repeat the same process in the subsequent academic semester.

Research Dissertation :-

BSW students are required to select an appropriate topic for their research dissertation in the Vth semester and complete the same in the VIth semester of the course. Research Dissertation will be submitted to the University before the commencement of VIth semester with the signature of the Candidates, Research

Guide and the Principal of the college. Research Dissertation will be evaluated for 100 Marks The research dissertation shall be assessed internally by guide 40 marks & externally by the examiner appointed by the University 60 marks (60:40 pattern)

Field Work Viva-Voce :-

There shall be an internal Viva-Voce on field work activities of 100 Marks at the end of each semester.

• Structure of M.S.W. Course:-

The MSW degree will be awarded to the student who completes a total of 4 semesters in minimum of two years, clearing examination held by the University for a Total of 24 papers in four semesters (Six papers in per semesters), Field work, Research Dissertation and other components as per semester structure. From the Academic Year 2014 -2015 University has introduced 60-40 Pattern, 60 Marks External + 40 Marks Internal Assessment on the basis of two Tests.

Eligibility :-

Graduate Candidates in any discipline of any university recognized by the UGC Shall be eligible to apply for the M.S.W. course.

50% of the sanctioned seats shall be reserved for BSW degree holders on the basis of merit for the admission to the M.S.W. Course.

The following shall be separate heads of passing :

- a) Written Theory Papers.
- b) Field Work
- c) Research Dissertation
- d) Viva– Voce

Failure in any one of the heads shall be considered as a failure at the MSW course.

Rules of ATKT :

A students must pass in 4 theory courses in each semester out of 6 courses to avail of the benefit of ATKT for the next semester. A student shall be allowed to keep term of semester - III, if he/she has no backlog and clears all the heads of passing of semester -I. A student failing in field work at any semester shall not be get the benefit of ATKT including Theory papers and will have to repeat the entire semester

Written Theory Papers:

The MSW course will be of 4 semesters. There shall be 6 theory papers in each semester of 100 marks each with 60:40 pattern of external and internal assessment.

Field Work:-

The field work for MSW course during 4 Semesters will include Orientation Visits, Concurrent Field Work, Rural Camp, Special Awareness Campaign, Study Tour and Block placements which are compulsory Field work shall be of 100 marks for each Semester which will require 50% for passing. Failure in field work in any Semester shall be declared as fail and student shall have to repeat the entire semester including theory courses .Each student will be required to put in 15 hours of field work per week in the organization where he/she is placed for field work.

Research Dissertation

The MSW students admitted to semester III shall select a Research topic in the beginning of the III rd Semester for Research Dissertation in consultation with the concerned Research Guides. The Research Dissertation will be submitted to the University before the commencement of IV Semesters with the signature of the candidates Research Guide & the principal of the college. The Research Dissertation shall carry 150 Marks and shall be evaluated externally by the University 90 marks and Internally 60 marks. A candidate must obtain minimum 50% marks for passing in Research Dissertation.

Viva-Voce:-

There shall be a viva-voce examination at the end of MSW Semester II and IV based on theory knowledge, research and field work practicum.

The Viva-voce of 50 marks in the MSW Semester II will be conducted internally by the college. The minimum marks required for passing the viva-voce are 50% for each viva-voce examination.

In IV semester Viva-Voce of 50 Marks shall be conducted externally by the University which will be based on theory, field work, research, professional development, and other related areas of specialization.

Block Placement:-

Every MSW student shall complete his/her Block Field Work (placement) for a period of one month (30 days) after the fourth Semester examination. The result of the candidate will be handed over to the college by the University only after submission of a report on successful completion of Block Field Work to the University.

OTHER INSTRUCTIONS:-**• Refund of Tuition fees:-**

The candidate canceling his confirmed admission will be entitled to receive the refund of fees after deducting the amounts as indicated below except otherwise prescribed by the state Government /University/Competent Authority.

• Grant of Terms:-

As far as possible 100% attendance is expected at the orientation programme and orientation visits, advanced orientation programme, field work, Rural Camps and study tours. The North Maharashtra University Stipulates 75% attendance in the college.

In normal Circumstances it is expected that student do not ask for leaves of absence from any of the academic activities. In very special circumstances, leave may be permitted with prior intimation and approval.

Leave of absence will be governed by the rules and shall not be accumulated over consecutive terms.

The Principal reserves the right to grant of terms. An undertaking will be taken from each student in relation to compliance of all the rules and regulations of this college. The Principal's decision will be final and binding in all matters pertaining to discipline.

● **Discipline:-**

A Copy of the College Rules and Regulations will be given to the student after seeking admission. All students are expected to abide by these rules throughout the period of training.

The College reserves the right to cancel the admission of any student who fails to observe the rules and discipline of the College.

In case a student is found to be unsuitable for the social work profession due to valid reasons, the Principal and the faculty reserve the right to ask the student to discontinue the course at any time during the period of training.

● **Ragging:-**

As per the law, Government and University rules and regulations 'ragging' in any form is strictly prohibited in the College Campus, Hostel, Field Work agencies or anywhere during the tenure of the course. Involvement of student directly or indirectly in any ragging activity will lead to cancellation of admission.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

● **Orientation:-**

The college organizes pre - admission counseling during the admission period every year. At the beginning of the academic year class- wise course orientation programs are conducted by the college every year for all students to explain the overall structure of BSW and MSW Courses.

● **Academic advice :-**

The college has developed a system for academic advice for the students. The responsibility to every class is assigned to two faculty members as a class in - charge and assistant class in - charge to provide support to the students, address their problems as well as regulate and coordinate class activities. For field work, each student is assigned a faculty member (field work supervisor). Each field work supervisor is in charge of 5-10 students. The field work supervisors guide the students in their field work through Individual Conferences once every week, Group Conferences once a month and also visits to the field.

● **Counseling Centre :-**

In the academic year 2009-10, the college started a Counseling Centre for the students. The counseling Centre, an integral part of the college, is a student support service intended to help students adapt and make the best of their learning environment. The objective of this Centre is to organize personality development programmes and counsel the students about family problems and psycho - social problems. The Centre therefore attempts to provide a nurturing environment wherein each student is empowered to face life challenges and move ahead to achieve their academic goals. Two of the faculty members provide counseling at the centre.

● **Mentoring:-**

The teachers develop a close professional relationship with students and support them in learning as well as for personal concerns, if needed. Teachers are approachable, understanding and helpful. so as to nurture the students and help them in their personal as well as professional growth.

● **Medical and Insurance:-**

All students of the college are covered by medical insurance policy as per the directive of the North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. Basic first aid facilities are available within the college premises and serious cases are referred to a nearby hospital

● **Student's Council:-**

The College constitutes a Student Council every year as per the guidelines of the University. A class representative, ladies representative, NSS representative, cultural representative and sports representative are selected according to students' academic performance in the preceding academic year and the general secretary is elected by representatives .

● **Student's magazine:-**

Every year the college publishes a magazine called *Samata*. The magazine focuses on one current problem every year and the students and staff write articles, poems on that specific issue. Most of the articles are written by students which helps in improving their writing skills and enhancing their creative and intellectual abilities. This magazine is very useful to the social work students for creating awareness on the social problems.

● **Earn and Learn Scheme :-**

This scheme is implemented by Student Welfare Unit. It is available to

students who are ready to work for few a hours in the college and earn money. This scheme is made available to deserving poor students. Applications are called from the students and based on the merits, students are selected for this scheme.

● **Economic Assistance Scheme:-**

This scheme is implemented by Student Welfare Unit. The students who are economically backward are given benefit of Economic Support Scheme of North Maharashtra University. Applications are called from the students and based on the merit, students are selected for this scheme.

● **Ramai Poli-Bhaji Centre :-**

The college provides mid-day meal (poli +bhaji) to needy, desiring students who come from far of villages at a nominal cost of Rs. 5/-.

● **Scholarship and Concessions:-**

Following scholarship and concession in fees are available to students joining the B.S.W. & M.S.W. course.

1. Government of Maharashtra student economically Backward class Scholarships for those students whose parents annual income does not exceed Rs. 1,00,000/- and who are domiciled in Maharashtra.
2. Government of India scholarships to backward class.
3. Government merit scholarship
4. Scholarship for the physically handicapped.

● **Hostel Accommodation:-**

The College has limited accommodation for about 24 male students and 16 female students. Students seeking accommodation to the hostel should indicate their requirement at the appropriate place in application form. Residents of the hostel will have to strictly abide by all the hostel rules. Breach of rules will result in disciplinary action such as cancellation of hostel admission or cancellation of admission from the Course.

ACTIVITIES :-

● **National Service Scheme (N.S.S.) :**

The N.S.S. Department was started in academic year 1996-97. NSS programme provides a variety of learning experiences which develop a sense of participation, service and achievement among the volunteers.

• Sports Unit:

• Career Guidance & Job placement Cell:

The Career Guidance & Job Placement Cell is one of the important cells of the college. Every year the placement cell receives correspondence for vacancies from various organizations, from all over India which are displayed on a special Notice Board. Campus Interviews are organized in the college by various organizations

• Life Long Learning Cell:

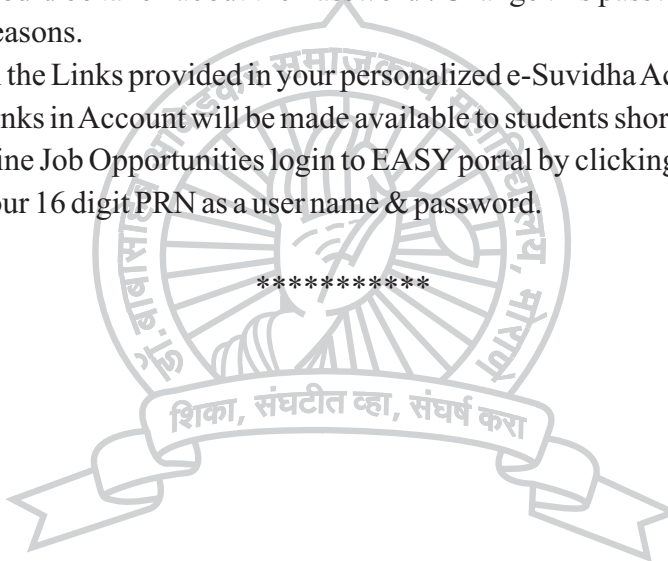

4. Student has to verify his/her Identity and Credential. This process is meant to confirm Student identity by submitting their personal information as given at the time of admission on Common Admission Form. For this student has to answer any five questions related to his/her personal information that he/she has written on Common Admission Form.

These questions may be of following types:

What is your place of birth? What is your date of birth? What is your guardian's annual income? What is your mobile No.?

What is your correspondence address's Pin code? What is your mothers first Name? etc.

5. After successfully answering the above kind of question, student has to create his / her own Password for log in.
6. If student fails to answer the question in three attempts his/her Account will be locked automatically. To unlock the Account student will have to contact the college and request them to release his /her Account.

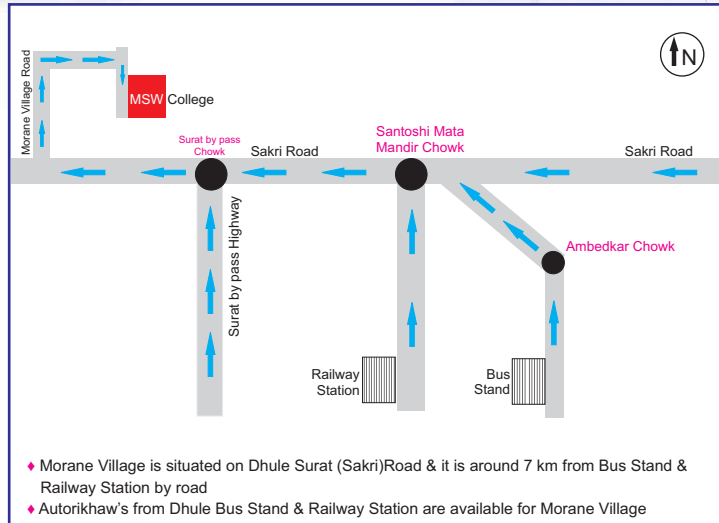
