1. International Youth Day: -

3. Indian Constitution Day: -

Constitution Day was celebrated in the college on 26th November. The objective of this program was to create awareness among the students about the Indian Constitution. Adv. Abhay Takasal (Lawyer and Social Worker), Aurangabad. He gave guidance on the topic "Indian Constitution and Right to Education."

Adv. Taksal said that the ideas we are expressing today are only possible because of the Constitution. As a student of social work education, students should study the Indian Constitution, its important articles and important provisions and apply them to the society. Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar was expected that it is up to the government of any ideology to act in accordance with the guidelines of the Indian Constitution.

He highlighted on free and compulsory education, said that free and compulsory education should be provided by the state. There was opposition to making such a provision in the Fundamental Rights, therefore included in the directive principals in the state policy. The condition of child education is still bad. Many child laborers are seen working on the streets. It seems to come from time to time. People need to vote with development issues in mind and not on the basis of Scheduled Castes. But it is being broken by making major changes in those laws. It is unfortunate to say that a nationwide strike has been called by the workers of India in celebration of Constitution Day today. The concept of country includes all the components of the country including women, children, SC, ST, workers. On this occasion, everyone should resolve to read the constitution and use the constitution for the benefit of the society. He expressed such an opinion.

Hon. Dr. Jalindar Adsule, in the presidential conclusion, we create our approach, the way we look at the Indian Constitution. Regarding what you are saying that it is difficult to understand the Indian Constitution. He said that, Adv. Abhay Takasal explained the importance of the Indian Constitution in words and also lay out very well on various aspects of the Indian Constitution. He also explained, the way in which the rulers look at the constitution in the last 70 years is wrong somewhere, also a series of issues have arisen in our country. Many decisions have been made on the issues of poverty, employment, various forms of injustice against women, and the recent judiciary. Considering all this, it seems that the Indian Constitution needs to be looked at differently. The Constitution needs to be properly implemented. There are many thoughts in our country. 48 students and teachers participated in the program.

4. World Human Rights Day: -

An online lecture on 'Vulnerable Groups and their Human Rights' was organized on December 10, 2020, occasion of World Human Rights Day. Adv. Vishal Salve was the resource person and the Chair person wad Dr. Jalindar Adsule. Adv.
