The report of various initiatives taken by this cell is as follows.

Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Earn and Learn Scheme :

Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Earn and Learn Scheme was implemented in the academic year 2019-2020 at Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work, Morane, Dhule with the help of Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon's Student Development Department. The scheme has been implemented in the college from August 2019 to March 2020.

Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon Student Development Department's Circular for all students in the college to participate in the Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Earn and Learn scheme, Hon. Prof.Dr. With the signature of Jalindar Adsule, the notice was issued through the Student Development Cell and the application was invited. Total 11 students from the college applied. The 11 students were interviewed in the meeting of the Student Development Advisory Committee of the college. As per the rules laid down by the university, a grant check signed by the principal and the student development officer was given to the student at the rate of Rs. 40 per hour according to the total number of working hours per month.

Student's speech:

College students expressed their thoughts on the occasion of World Tribal Day.

- 2. Suresh Jagtap Khajya Naik expressed his thoughts on how he worked on the lives of tribal people.
- 3. Suresh Gaikwad Holi, marriage system mountain gods, tried to present the culture of the tribals.
- 4. Ujwala Jadhav She performed the song Adivasi Rani.
- 5. Lalita Sable Tribal Problems Superstition, Tribal Education Problems, Tribal Health Problems, Malnutrition, Tribal Fraud, etc.
- 6. Ajay Gangurde He performed the song Konkani Bhasha.
- 7. Sunil Bahiram In today's situation, despite the availability of education opportunities for tribal children, the problems faced by tribal children in terms of education, as well as the current state of education of tribal children, briefly expressed his thoughts.

The keynote Address: Prof. Dr. Mohan Pawara (University Management Council Member):

Prof. Dr. Mohan Pawara expressed his views on the diversity of tribal society, dowry system, marriage system, culture, and changes in the present situation. Maharani Hirai, Baburao Shedmake, Narayan Singh Uike, Raghoji Bhangre, Bakhat Bulandshah, Dalpatshah, Raghunathshah, Veerangana Rani Durgavati Madavi, Kumra Bhima, Tantraya Bhill, Khajya Naik, Khejya Naik, Birsa Munda, Birsa Mundai You will find many precious gems like Tana Bhagat. Today, the history of all these needs to be brought before the world.

While understanding the significance of 9th August, it is necessary to understand the problems of the tribal community, their highly distinctive culture, their relationship with nature, their high values of life. Attacks on tribal culture and their integration in the name of the mainstream have endangered tribal culture. At the international level, they should be made aware of the signals for the rights of the tribal community, raising awareness among them for their rights, living together in the community, enriching their lives as a group, all these things. He expressed the view that this should be celebrated as a day of self-respect. He also presented the poem 'Mahuchi Phule'.

The chief guest speech: (Prof.Dr. Mahendra Kumar Wadhe)

The chief guest of the program was Prof.Dr. Mahendra Kumar Wadhe gave guidance on tribal history. It sheds light on the language of the tribals, the movement, and the life of Birsa Munda. Tribals are the aborigines of the earth and there are 461 tribal tribes living in India. Some more castes are on the way to be included in the tribal caste today. Inspired by the United Nations, 1994-2005 was celebrated as the 'Tribal Decade'. In India, mainly Chenchu Kadar, Kota Negro, Proto Australoid ethnic groups live in Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. In Central India, Bihar, Orissa, Madhya Pradesh, Pt. The major castes living in the state of Bengal are Gond, Santhal, Bhumji, Ho, Orion, Munda, Korva. The Bhils live in Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Daman-Diu, Dadra, Nagar Haveli, and in the Union Territories. Apart from these, Koli, Kokana-Kokani, Warli, Thakur, Katkari, Andhra Pardhan, Kolam, Korku, Madia, Gond, Raj-Gond tribes live. Tribals are not Hindus, the court ruled in a case on January 19, 1979. Tribal society has been suffering injustice since the time of Eklavya. Even historians have not stopped doing injustice. Tribal families should get their Nasgirk traditional habitat, they should get the lands they use, he said, adding that efforts need to be made for this.

Presidential Conclusion:

President of the program Prof. Dr. Raghunath Mahajan gave guidance on the present situation of the tribal community, the way of life of the tribal community, the diversity of the tribal community, and various features of the tribal community. In the same way that it is the responsibility of the government to bring the tribal community into the mainstream of development, social activists need to work for the development of the tribal community, he said.

Lecture- 1

Subject: Personality development

Date: 06/09/2019

Resource Person: Prof. Vilas Chavan (Palesha College, Dhule)

Prof. Vilas Chavan Sir explained in detail what this difference is and how it makes a personality. Students were given explanations through questions and answers on what exactly can be defined as personality. Lecture - 2

Subject: Competitive Exam Guidance

The mentality of preferring competitive exams as a career option has now grown in most of the students. Turning to competitive exams is not just about government jobs, good salaries, red light vehicles, social prestige. So it is very important to be clear about exactly what you want to achieve. Lecture - 3
