1. Two Days Workshop on “Institutional Quality Development”: -

1. Principal Address Program:

Regarding admission, the college has given the link to online admission on its website of the college. Each student should confirm their admission online by going to that link. This year's admission brochure is also given on the website. Online fees must be paid at the time of admission. Your documents need to be uploaded while filling up

the online admission form. Learn to change with the times, it is necessary to look at what is happening with a studious attitude. It is necessary to learn to be aware of new technologies. When students asked questions about fees, Hon. Principal Sir informed him about it.

The college is facing NAAC. The college has sent a report to the NAAC. The NAAC Peer Team will visit our college next month. The Principal gave detailed information about the NAAC report.

2. Economic Support for Economically Weaker Students Scheme :

4. Health check-up:

The Students Development Cell conducted a health check-up programme for BSW-I, MSW-I, MSW-II and Hostels students with the help of Jawahar Medical foundation's Medical College, Morane, Dhule. Health Check-up camp organized on 28th December 2021. The health check-up of the newly admitted students was done by the expert doctors of Jawahar Medical Foundation. A brief report of the health examination has been sent to the Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. A total of 114 students were examined.

5. Voter Registration and Voter Awareness Program :

Voter Registration and Voter Awareness Program was held online on 22nd January 2021 at 4 pm. The resource person of the program was Hon. Shri. Bhim Raskar (Director, Resource and Support Center for Development, Mumbai). The President of the program was Principal Hon. Dr. Jalindar Adsule. The event was conducted online with the help of Zoom app.

Program Introduction:

The introductory speech of the program was delivered by Dr. Dilip Ghongade. The Voter Registration and Voter Awareness Program is being implemented by the Election Commission. Voters can register and amend their names in the voter list till November 30, 2021. Students from all classes in our college want to participate in this voter registration program. In the village where our students do field work, voter registration and voter awareness are to be done from 23rd to 27th November 2021. The program has been organized to provide detailed information to the students about voter registration and voter awareness.

Key Guidance: Hon. Mr. Bhim Raskar (Director, Resource and Support Center for Development, Mumbai)

The keynote speaker of the program was Shri. Bhim Raskar gave the following guidance to the students on online voter registration and voter awareness. The most deprived sections of the society are Scheduled Castes-Tribes, Women. The main reason for this deprivation is poverty. Elections must be transparent if democracy is to be strengthened. After the establishment of the Election Commission, the election commission started registering political parties. The voter list is still not comprehensive. The names of those who have been omitted should be included in the voter list, those whose names are incorrect should be omitted and those who have completed 18 years of age should be registered and included. The voter list should be refined. Registration can be done by going to the website of NVSP, by going to the tahsil office, and by filling up the form. Information needs to be obtained from BLO. The first thing is to see if I am a voter. If so, check if the voting card and the information on it are correct. It is important to know whose names are not in the voter list. It is also important to see which wrong names are in the voter list. The higher the turnout, the stronger the democracy.

Presidential Conclusion:

The President of the program, Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule gave the following guidance to the students. There will be no lectures in the college from 23rd to 27th November 2021. During this period, everyone wants to participate in the voter registration and voter awareness campaign. You have to register for one week in the village, community where the students do fieldwork. Students who are not on the voter list should register so that any campaign can start from you. If there is a mistake in the name, the mistake should be corrected. Posters should be put up in the village regarding voter awareness. Voter registration forms should be brought from the tahsil office, filled, and submitted to the

college. Forms will be submitted to the tahsil office through the college. Each student should register as many names as possible. People need to be motivated to register.

After this, the questions of the students were taken. Dr. Dilip Ghongade gave information on how to register voters online. Dr. Farida Khan expressed gratitude.

6. Voter Registration and Voter Awareness Campaign :

Voter Registration and Voter Awareness Campaign was implemented by the College from 23rd to 27th November 2021 by a letter from the State Election Commission. On 23rd November 2021 at 9:30 am, the principal of the college Dr. Jalindar Adsule guided the students on voter registration and voter awareness campaign. Dr. Dilip Ghongade informed the students on how to register voters online and offline. College students immediately registered voter forms online. Some students were sent to the tahsil office and the collector's office and asked to bring the forms for voter registration, correction and omission. Students in field work from each teacher were told to register to vote at their field workplace. The college students successfully carried out voter registration and voter awareness campaigns at their field work from 23rd to 27th November 2021.

He also started an organization for the children of prostitutes. He was also running the Marathi magazine 'Sugava'. From there, he started publishing Sugava. He had published many books on Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. Prof. Vilas Wagh is a man who is loved by people. Living with a group of people. Gradually it became clear that there were many people with Sir. I have seen their journey grow through the connection of human beings. From a common man to a senior guide of the society, he had a mixed personality.

The principal of the college, Dr. Jalindar Adsule in the presidential conclusion, Not only Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar's ideological legacy, but also a personality who cherishes his touch with faith is Prof. Wagh sir. Before starting any work, it is necessary to know about it in detail. He started a new work of transformation by starting a hostel for Devdasi's children through Sarveshan Seva Sangha. Neha Gujarati (District Jail Officer, Dhule) was present. Introductory introduction of this workshop by Dr. Farida Khan.

At the beginning of the program, The idols of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar and Savitribai Phule was worshiped by the dignitaries. College students performed a welcome song. A different process was implemented in the inaugural program. The workshop was inaugurated in a very different way. A new initiative was implemented to blindfold the girls and open them as if they were blindfolds and take them to a new bright environment. In it, he briefed the students on how to plan the program throughout the day. The program was divided into four sessions.

First session

Subject: Confidence in women

Resource Person: Neha Gujarati (District Jail Officer, Dhule)

The first session of the workshop was started by the District Jail Officer Hon. Neha Gujarati discussed this with the student. In it, she shared her life experiences, life introductions, and other guidance. Guided on what to do to develop your personality. The students were given guidance on how to deal with difficult situations and how to build their personalities. Students should go in search of themselves. Then we can succeed even in

difficult times. Women just need to be made aware that they are capable. She gave detailed guidance on this. Thus the first session end. The first session was thanked by Jaimala Nikam.

Season 2:

Subject: Gender Equality

Resource person: Dr. Shobha Shinde (Former Director, Center for Women's Studies, Poet Bahinabai North Maharashtra University Jalgaon)

In this session, Dr. Shobha Shinde shared information on how women are capable. Also, how boys and girls are discriminated against from an early age is already ingrained in the mind and this is already remembered till the end but this mentality should be changed. It will help to change the attitude of society when women make their own decisions. Many such restrictions of time and rules are imposed and without wasting your confidence, you should believe that I am beautiful and capable, he explained.

The patriarchal system seems to have influenced girls from an early age. By dividing the toys, one element is said to be weak and the other strong. At the same time, in many places, women do not have the right to make their own decisions even after getting a job. Women need to be able to make decisions. Only she should understand that she has the power to change the world. Dr. Shobha Shinde gave guidance in this regard that we should follow the example of many women who have gone to higher positions and moved on to do something new.

The third session

Subject: Women's Law

Resource person: Hon. Anuradha Kharat (Counselor, Family Court, Dhule)

On the subject of laws for women, Hon. Anuradha Kharat guided the students. There are 74 laws for women in the country. It is important to be more careful not to fall victim to sexual abuse. Women are subjected to injustice and laws have been enacted to give them justice. Guided on what laws have been enacted for the protection of women through ppt and what process should be followed to get justice. The use of technology also traps women in this crisis and they commit suicide if they cannot get out of it. Therefore, to face these crises, a valuable message was given in this workshop.

Fourth season:

Subject: Women's safety

Resource person: Hon. Vijaya Pawar (Sub-Inspector of Police, Taluka Police Station, Dhule)

Hon. Vijaya Pawar guided the students on self-defense or women's security. She informed about some important laws for the safety of women. The law is designed to give women justice. Women should come forward to seek justice without fear. Underage Boys-Guided by which law to seek help in case the girls run away or the girls run away. Also, if someone is molesting girls, you should resist the person without fear and report your complaint to the police station. Guided on women's safety so that no one would dare to do so.

Program concluding :

The last stage of the workshop was the concluding program. Dr. Hasim Shaikh (Dhule District Student Development Coordinator), Dr. Jalindar Adsule (Principal , Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work, Morane, Dhule), Dr. Dilip Ghongade (Student Development Officer) and Dr. Farida Khan (Yutisabha Workshop Coordinator) was present.

Dr. Hasim Shaikh guided the students about various schemes implemented for students through Student Development Department, Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhary North Maharashtra University Jalgaon. The President of the program, Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule expressed the view that students need to work hard to achieve personality development.

On this occasion, some young women were given certificates by the dignitaries as a representation. The students who came to the workshop expressed their thoughts. Dr. Dilip Ghongade expressed his gratitude. A total of 50 students participated in the workshop. Thus, the one-day personality development workshop was held.

10. Ragging prevention counseling workshop

Department of Student Development, Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhary North Maharashtra University Jalgaon and Samata Shikshan Sanstha Pune's Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Social Work College Morane, Dhule jointly organized a ragging prevention counseling workshop on 19th March 2022. The word ragging is familiar to all colleges, so college students have to endure physical, mental, and financial hardship while studying. This affects all the personalities of the students. Their academic losses are huge. Overall, ragging is a major obstacle in their careers. That is why the University Grants Commission has taken various measures to stop this practice among college students. Efforts are being made to prevent ragging among students through the enactment of new laws, hiplines, various workshops, and activities.

Opening session:

Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhary North Maharashtra University under Ragging prevention counseling workshop was organized on 19th March 2022 at Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work, Morane, Dhule. On the occasion of the inauguration of the workshop, Hon. Vijaya Pawar (Sub-Inspector of Police, Dhule) was present. The president of the program is the principal of the college, Dr. Jalindar Adsule, Chief Guest Dr. K.M. Borse (Vice-Principal, SSVPS College of Science, Dhule) was present. While inaugurating the workshop, Hon. Vijaya Pawar inaugurated the workshop by giving a detailed presentation on what exactly is ragging and how it affects the lives of students and what is the role of colleges and police in this and how it can change the careers of students.

After this, the president of the program, the principal of the college, Dr. Jalindar Adsule informed about the various activities taking place in the colleges to prevent ragging in our colleges and also instructed the students on how to ensure that ragging does not occur in any way. Students should cooperate, the new student is in a state of confusion when he enters the college so he should be counseled through the college counseling center as well as the student can complain to the complaint box in the college. The inaugural session was moderated by Assistant Student Development Officer Dr. Farida Khan then thanked Student Development Officer Dr. Dilip Ghongade agreed and the inaugural session ended.

First session

Resource person: Hon. Vice-Principal Prof. Dr. K.M. Borse (SSVPS College of Science, Dhule)

Vice-Principal Dr. K. M. Borse said the definition of ragging is how ragging is practiced in various colleges in India. What obstacles have ragging created in students' careers so far? Similarly, how many students also commit suicide due to ragging, how it affects the family of the students, as ragging causes physical, mental, and financial abuse to the students, which creates difficulties in the academic development of many students. Explained to the students through several examples. Drafted the provisions of the Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999. He also informed the students about the strict laws and regulations of the state government against heinous crimes like ragging, the University Grants Commission (UGC) as per the directions of the Supreme Court and the High Court as well as the circulars issued by the state government and the provisions of the Indian Penal Code. Dr. Borse Sir also guided the students through answering questions about ragging.

Season 2:

Resource Person: Dr. Hasim Shaikh (Dhule District Coordinator, Student Development Department)

What is the purpose of conducting ragging prevention counseling workshops through the Department of Student Development, Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhary North Maharashtra University? In case of any incident related to ragging in the college, which department of the university should be contacted? Dr. Hasim Shaikh Sir informed the students.

Dr. Hasim Shaikh told that this ragging should be understood if any act of misconduct is being done to create in the students a feeling of physical or mental harm or is likely to be reached or a feeling of fear or apprehension. The smallest of these include ragging, teasing, abusing, threatening, taunting, teasing, or forcing a student to do something he or she is unwilling to do voluntarily. Therefore, no student should commit such misdeeds with his fellow students. Students were instructed that if such an act is committed not only on the college premises but also outside the college premises, it is considered ragging and the law provides for imprisonment of up to two years and a fine of Rs 10,000.

The third session

Resource person: Adv. Sarla Sancheti (Family Court, Dhule)

In the third session, Adv. Sarla Sancheti guided about directed the state government to ban ragging in the Maharashtra Act 1999, Supreme Court in 2007, and Mumbai High Court in 2010 to ban ragging, circular issued by the government in 2015 as per the directions of the Supreme Court and the High Court, as per the decision of the Supreme Court. The students were informed about the circular issued by UGC in the year 2018, as well as some important provisions of the Indian Penal Code. At the same time, although this type of ragging may seem easy to the students, how can it be a crime, and how much do the concerned student and his family have to suffer as a result legal action be taken against the ragging student and his career is ruined. The student may be expelled from college. He is also sentenced to two years imprisonment and ten thousand rupees. Not only the students but also the heads of the educational institutions where the incident took place are subject to legal action, so ragging prevention committees and squads have been set up in every college. Instructions in this regard have been given by UGC to all the universities and each college the university. At the same time, each college informed that it is mandatory to put up billboards on the visible area which may be a form of punishment against ragging and what exactly is ragging.

Fourth session

Resource Person: Dr. Raghunath Mahajan (Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work, Dhule)

In the fourth session, Dr. Raghunath Mahajan said that if any kind of ragging is noticed by the students or if it is happening in their case, the students should register their complaint by calling the toll-free number of UGC helpline 1800 180 552. Along with that is the UGC website, on which you should send an e-mail regarding your complaint. Therefore, the UGC will immediately be informed of any such misconduct and the UGC directs the concerned universities and colleges to take action against it. Therefore, students should use toll-free number and e-mail to curb such acts without fear.

Students should not engage in any form of ragging. This is because if any action is taken against them, then when they have to take the character verification certificate at the time of employment, it becomes difficult to get it and it becomes an obstacle in the career of the students. Students should be aware of this and a committee on anti-ragging has been set up in our college. Its coordinator, as well as the panel, informed that any action could be taken regarding ragging on the darshan area.

Closing session:

The chief guest in the concluding session was Dr. R. S. Mahajan, and the president of this session was Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule. Dr. R. S. Mahajan While guiding the students, as the chief guest said that the students were instructed to report to the concerned committee and principal in case of any such misconduct in the college and all the students need to make efforts to create a conducive atmosphere in the college.

The students asked many questions related to ragging. After answering the questions, the students resolved their doubts, and after that Hon. Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule Sir appealed to the students to cooperate by creating a playful atmosphere in the colleges and creating a sense of cooperation among all the students.

Thanks for the program Considered by Dr. Dilip Ghongade. Thus the ragging prevention counseling workshop was conducted. In this workshop, 64 students participated.

A workshop on Social Work Profession Challenges and Responses was organized by the Research and Training Center of Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work from 21st March 2022 to 26th March 2022. The workshop was inaugurated by Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule. Prof. Dr. Gopal Nimbalkar, Prof. Dr. Dilip Ghongade, Mr. Gajendra Jagdev (Librarian) and trainees were present at the inauguration ceremony.

Objectives of the Program :-

- 3. To understand the issues and challenges in social work social work profession.**

Dated March 21, 2022

Session II: - Tribal community issues and solutions

Rasaurse Person: - Prof. Dr. Dilip Ghongade

After the inaugural session, Professor Dilip Ghongade guided the students on the issues and solutions of the tribal community. Professor Dilip Ghongade first introduced the concept, structure and culture of the tribal community. He discussed various clauses regarding protection of tribal's in the Constitution among the trainees.

Speaking further, Dr. Dilip Ghongade while giving information about the problems of the tribal's he said that displacement is one of the main problems of the tribal's. He said that if one million people are displaced every year, then 55 per cent of them are tribal's. Talking about the health of tribal's, he said that malnutrition is high among children due to lack of proper nutrition. Anemia is more common in women. The situation of education in the tribal community is not much different. Although the rate of education has increased, it is not satisfactory. The proportion of higher educated tribal's is low. Rehabilitation of IDPs due to various projects needs to be given priority while addressing the issues of tribal's. But we don't even listen to his personal opinion and the process of communication is breaking down and so we have to develop the personality so how should our personality be. For this we must read the book. Because the latest process is forwarding messages, you don't read beyond that. You should start the writing process. We must be able to express ourselves. As your self-confidence increases and your self-confidence increases, your personality will develop. He made this clear in his speech.



The chief guest Mr. Nitin Thakur guided by the students that if they want to give you a competitive exam, you have to prepare yourself that way. We must give ourselves time in that way. It is important to check your own intelligence. And in recent times, if you are preparing for a competitive exam, you should have your own plan. It is necessary to observe oneself, observing oneself improves us and also boosts our self-confidence, he said, adding that there is a little purpose in pursuing our own interests from competitive exams. But you have to develop this through competitive exams. He did such valuable guidance.

❖ **Subject - Communication Skills**

❖ **Resource person - Hon. Mr. Rajesh Vaidya**

(Director, Nirmiti Foundation, Deopur, Dhule)

Mr. Vaidya guided us on how to develop communication skills and how to communicate well. We can develop communication skills on our own without taking any kind of classes. Communication skills develop your personality. A person's facial expressions, gestures, and spoken language communicate. Communication skills should be exercised with restraint. When speaking, one should respect the other. We need to build confidence when communicating. Others should clearly understand what you are saying. They should be explained. It should contain facts while speaking. When communicating, you need to think in terms of others, and you need to have a strong voice.



Sir said one always remembers that there are 120 types of personality. Also, a person has external mind and inner mind. The human mind is 10% active and 90% dark. Rules of personality development-We are not as wise as we understand ourselves and others are not as foolish as we understand others.

When we will communicate, the subject matter should be spoken in a way that is relevant to the other person. In this session of the workshop, Sara tried to impart communication skills to the students through this medium as an opportunity for the communication skills students. No matter how many troubles come in life, don't lose the courage to try. Always keep trying and you will definitely get success from it.

He explained to the students how to develop personality in a very simple and easy way as well as making a triangle out of a wooden block as well as what is given in the pictures, creating a ball tower. Various games like balancing were taken to check the intelligence. How to speak? What should be its intensity? Explain topics such as easy, simple and concise commentary, interacting with each other, etc. Facial expressions are created in a

total of 15,000 ways, there are 70,000 types of communication and body language, language exchange is 30 percent, etc. The effort has been made by Sara through her speech.

In this session, Hon. Vaidya Sir guided the students on positive attitude. What exactly do they mean by positive and negative? Positivity is ignorance not positivity but positivity is how we look at something? Which way do you look? These things depend on it. At the same time, never give up in the first attempt. As long as there is no success, there should be effort. Think about how you can differentiate your point of view from others, as well as the various games (which will definitely give you something to look forward to). In it, everyone guided the ball through the ball object, photo print, colors chart with a lot of laughter and play. They are as follows

1. Surviving in this world
2. Surviving on your own
3. Keep alive all the vegetation on this earth
4. Stay optimistic

The combination of all the above is called positive attitude and he took various small and big activities to make all these matters clear. We need to look at things in a positive light. Your point of view needs to be formed from the mind. We decide positive and negative things by our nature and experience. Such sirs took games with the student and kind of. From which the point of view of the person is seen, we should accomplish our goal by thinking from all sides and not just from one side. The session provided valuable guidance to the students on how to create a positive attitude through various sports.

Second Session - 2.00 to 4.00

❖ **Subject - UPSC Exam Preparation**

❖ **Keynote Speaker - Hon'ble Mr. Vibhor Bothe**
(Director Vindhyan Academy, Nashik)

In the second session, Mr. Vibhor Bothe was invited to interact with the students on the subject of preparation for the Central Public Service Commission Examination (UPSC).. Initiating his guidance, he first asked the students if any of the students present had appeared for the UPSC examination. After that, Sir said, those who want to do something special in life, should definitely take the UPSC exam. UPSC is one of the top ten exams in the world. If you do a Google search, you will find difficult exams in the world and the names of three exams in the top ten. The most difficult is the name of UPSC, Civil Services.



To pass UPSC exam, you need to be strong and cheerful. There are only two restrictions for this exam. One is that you should be 21 years old and graduation should be taken in a good university. In the workshop, Sara has tried to make the students understand from which link to fill the form to how to study it. In the initial stage of UPSC exam, name, mother's name, father's name, education, hobbies, birthday, etc. are asked.

UPSC has 36 centers in India and 12 centers in Maharashtra. There is a fee of Rs. 100 / - for this exam and it is completely free for all women. This was followed by guidance on how the exams are conducted. The first stage is the preliminary test. It falls into two types. It contains GS paper i.e. General Studies. Paper is in Hindi + English language. This paper is for 200 marks. The books NCERT should be studied for this purpose, he added. The second paper is C-SAT. What do you take with you to the exam center? Which doesn't work? That said. Digital watch does not work.

It was approved in C-SAT (Civil Service Aptitude Test) 2014. Ethics have been included since 2013. After all the exams, there is a personality test exam. In the first phase i.e. GS paper is always cut off.

In 2016, 12 lakh students filled up the UPSC forms, out of which 9 lakh appeared for the exams. Then the main exam had only 15,000 students. The main exam is for 1750 marks. UPSC is a leader in terms of language. It uses a total of 22 languages. Writing should be controlled while giving papers in this way. Papers are made in 4 ways. The second paper of GS is on Political Science and the third paper is on Economic Science and Technology and the fourth paper is on Ethics.

There should be a vigilant and quick decision maker for UPSC. Order should be received and implemented immediately. In this, Sara told a very important story about the Army. It was about the rules here.

- Rule number 1 - Boss is always right
- Rule number 2 - Remember the rule number one.

It means that the order received will be fulfilled immediately. The entire paper of UPSC depends on writing. At the time of introduction, the first thing to ask is the name, where it came from, what village it belongs to, its characteristics, some special events that happened at the time of birth. UPSC has full use of Psychology. There will be more information about that when answering. That should be the focus. So this exam is related to psychology. The question that is asked should be answered immediately. But Saran also told me how to have an outlook while giving an interview.

In all these sessions, Sir guided the students about UPSC in a very informative manner. How to fill UPSC exam form? Which link? What is the fee? How to study? How many marks are there? How is the exam conducted? Etc. Sir had tried to remove all doubts and fears. Overall, this guide will change the mindset of some students and help them to develop a positive attitude towards competitive examinations.

❖ **Subject - Preparation for MPSC**
❖ **Keynote Speaker - Shri Mayur Patil**
(Vindhyan Academy, Nashik)

Mr. Mayur Patil informed the students about the Maharashtra Public Service Commission Examination (MPSC). Initially, examinations are conducted for the

administrative post of Maharashtra Public Service Commission. In this important posts like Deputy Collector, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Tehsildar, Deputy Tehsildar, Assistant Commissioner of Sales Tax, Assistant Director Finance and Accounts Department, Group Development Officer are filled by MPSC.

The pre-examination syllabus paper of MPSC is a multiple choice question format. A total of 150 questions are asked in the exam. Two marks are given for each question. Therefore, the whole paper is assumed to be 300 marks. The time for the exam is about 90 minutes i.e. 1.30 hours. Out of 150 questions asked in the exam, 20 questions are based on arithmetic and the rest are based on general knowledge. Paper No. 01 Questions are asked based on grammar related to Marathi and English language. Common vocabulary, syntax type questions are asked. Paper No. 02 Relevant Questions of Arts Branch Information on historical and modern history of India, especially geography and gram panchayat administration of India and Maharashtra, Indian economy, political science, constitution of India, political affairs, national and international affairs etc. He also said that the Indian economy can be studied from Ranjan Kolambe's book and Paryavaran Tushar Ghorpade (Sahyadri Publication).

This session provided information on how to prepare for the MPSC exam. How to prepare while studying for MPSC? How is the paper? Detailed guidance was given in this regard. Through this, the students realized that only those who work hard will succeed. In this way the teacher guided very well and it will help the students to move forward easily and will definitely help the student to become an excellent one.

He also gave some examples of MPSC UPSC and Entrepreneurship. Some people have become big entrepreneurs after passing the MPSC exam. For this, one's own plan should be prepared.



The job sector is very competitive in this age of competition where young people should turn to entrepreneurs. Today, all the youth are preparing for the MPSC exam and failing that exam creates mental stress and chooses the option of suicide. Young people should try to become entrepreneurs without considering competitive exams. Today's era is known as bureaucracy. The youth guided all the youth on how to be an entrepreneur while choosing bureaucratic clothes. Sara guided the youth for the future through her speech. He also influenced the students by doing some shershare from his speeches. Through speech they can become good entrepreneurs and give job opportunities to friends most important point is that this is what happens when a person learns in a school of experience

Chair Person Principal Dr. Jalindar Adsule Sir while expressing his thoughts said that now is the age of competition and if we want to survive in this age of competition, it is very important to prepare for competitive exams. This is a very important opportunity to participate in the administrative service through competitive examinations if you want to fulfill important responsibilities in the administrative system. Overview

During the last year, we tried to contribute our bit and tried to make a difference in the lives of communities and individuals. The COVID-19 pandemic brought with it unprecedented crises on social, economic, and humanitarian levels. We focused on awareness generation and advocacy programmes with our target communities and local government bodies, advocating for the access and availability of services to the communities and children. It is heartening to note that even in the face of daunting effects of COVID-19, the project stood firmly and delivered its humanitarian and developmental imperative

During, 2021-22, our primary focus has been on enabling and supporting children and their families to take effective steps to overcome the unprecedented humanitarian crises posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Our response has been centered on ensuring vulnerable families have access to food and nutrition promoting awareness on COVID appropriate behaviour and vaccination and assisting children in coping with educational gaps. Special attention was paid to the elderly.

Many people living in poverty and vulnerable situations are unaware of their rights and entitlements that are provided for their benefit by the government programmes and schemes. Organisations like ours are consistently working with key stakeholders to build this awareness and bridge the gaps.

Career Oriented Courses

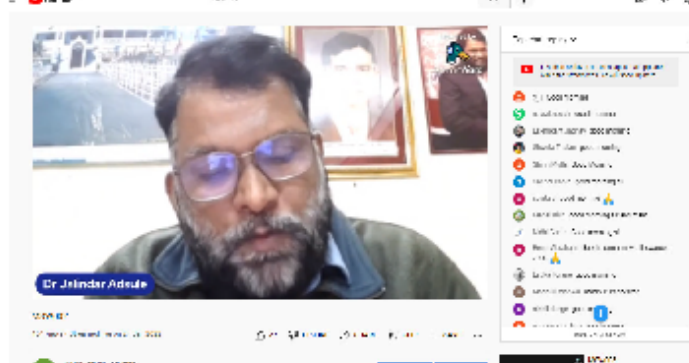
