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INTRODUCTION:

Samata Shikshan Sanstha, Pune is a registered Social Service Agency established in 1972 under the leadership of Prof. Vilas Wagh with a very broad Vision to serve the downtrodden and weaker Sections of Society. Since its inception, it has been rendering Social Service to Society through a number of programs and activities by educational and Social Service agencies such as Ashram Schools, Hostel for poor girls and boys and children homes, etc.

The organization functions on a strong conviction that people of humanity can make a difference in the lives of many of those who are less fortunate and follow beings of the Society by creating a spirit of goodwill. Similarly, by looking into the problems of the people and needs of the area an educational institution known as Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work was started by Samata Shikshan Sanstha in the year 1994-95 at Morane (Nakane) Tal & Dist Dhule.

The College of Social Work is affiliated with North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon, and is financially supported by the Department of Social Welfare, Government of Maharashtra. The College is located on Dhule – Sakari Road at Morane about 7 km from the district place and situated in the premises having about 2-5 acres of land and the building for the college purpose. It has its own library and reading room with more than 8,000 Books, Journals, and magazines on subjects related to Social Work.

The College imparts training in Social Work both at undergraduate as well as post-graduate levels, leading to three-year Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) and Two Years Master of Social Work (MSW) courses respectively. Both the Courses are generic in nature but likely to have one or two more Specializations to prepare the students to accept the challenges and take up the responsibilities of working with people having different problems and areas having their own needs with holistic and participative approaches.

The whole process of Social Work education and training followed by the College of Social Work includes class- room teaching of theory subjects, fieldwork practice, and practical research in respective areas and fields. The Social Work training also emphasizes on exposure of students to the field realities and socio-economic conditions of the people living in rural, tribal and urban areas. Students are also involved in regular well scheduled individual conferences, group discussion, paper presentations, seminars, workshops, rural camps and study tours etc.

The Social Work faculty comprises of well qualified and experienced teachers in their respective fields of specialization. Both, teaching and non-teaching staff of the College work as a team having close and personal touch with the students and day today functioning of the College. Efforts are

made to keep the students and staff always busy with various academic, practical and extracurricular activities of the College.

In the Academic Year 2022-23 following programs were organized by IQAC.



Organization's Activities/Programs and Procedures:

He said that farmers should be helped to make them financially capable. Such a picture will be seen in the future. He mentioned many examples of how much fertilizers will be used in agriculture today, food shortages are going to increase, and sources of income are going to decrease. There is no such kind of agricultural policy in our country. While living in today's life, the price of farmers' cotton is 6000 rupees per quintal, but after the same cotton product goes to the merchant, the merchant makes clothes and sells them for up to 1.5 lakh in the market. Such is the situation that the bullet train is going to pass through our Maharashtra, but the youth like us should realize that it has no importance. There are still no roads in our rural areas, so what about the people of the rural areas of this bullet train will be used. Today the land cannot be used properly. so, the farmer is selling

the land. Big businessmen are trying to grab that land. Farmers in India are facing various/many problems. Farmers face many problems to water their crops. There are many schemes for farmers but due to lack of financial support from the government, various poor farmers commit suicide. People who are living in poverty. It is necessary to start a new scheme for the poor people at the government level and strictly implement and monitor the scheme. I think we should save Mahatma Gandhiji's thoughts. In the current situation, the political and social and economic conditions in the countries are creating a situation that complements the increase in inequality. On the one hand the poor are getting poorer and the rate of poverty is increasing. On the other hand, one class is getting more and more rich, and a big disparity is being created according to class, Prof. Sharad Patil expressed at the inauguration.

He expressed his gratitude to the college for inviting him at the inaugural function of the conference. Best wishes to all for the success of the conference.

2. Prof. Dr. Manoj Parmar (Bijbhashak):

The speaker of this conference Prof. Dr. Manoj Parmar expressed his opinion as follows. He explained the causes of poverty or the increase in poverty, and the effects on the society. He presented some international statistics and presented the nature of the problem of poverty in the world. Eradication of poverty ie establishment of social justice and human rights.17 goals and strategies to be achieved in 2030. How to do it correctly. MPI has three dimensions 1. Health 2. Indicating health 3. Health measurement 3. Education quality in 111 countries One point Two Arabs people live in poverty. The poor have no home, no schools to educate the children, no enough books to teach them. Multi-Dimensional Index A person gets Rs.150. Those persons are considered to be poor. In our word, Khandesh are considered as working people. According to the Women Development Report, we are at number 132. 22.5% of people are living below poverty line in portal publication.

Where there is corruption, there is poverty. Where there is no security, there is poverty. There were two persons in India who discussed poverty alleviation in rural areas and birth as a social issue. Two such important persons are Mahatma Gandhi and Babasaheb Ambedkar. In rural areas, a person becomes a sarpanch, but they do not get the right to take decisions. What has been achieved in the ongoing poverty alleviation programs so far? Employment has increased, the situation has changed, but there are some problems that need to be removed, the first is to pay attention to how to increase our income. In rural areas a person becomes a sarpanch but has No rights and authority to take decisions. The Human Rights Commission should implement various activities for the poor. We celebrate Independence Amrit Mahotsav, but have we freed ourselves

from poverty? Have you ever thought about it? We need to think about it. He expressed such an opinion.

It records people committing suicide due to business and job related difficulties, violence, family problems, mental illness, alcohol addiction and financial loss. According to this report, 1 lakh 53 thousand 52 people committed suicide in India in 2020. It has been revealed that 1 lakh 64 thousand 33 people committed suicide in 2021 with an increase of six percent.

Guided by Chief Guest:- Hon. Mrs. Urmila Kanade (Professional Councillor, Janasahas Sanstha, Dhule)Hon. Urmila Kanade started her lecture. She told that suicide rate is one million one person commits suicide every four seconds every year. September 10 is celebrated as Suicide Day. Importantly, World Suicide Day is celebrated all over the world. Why should it be time for the World Health Organization to take a stance on this topic because the suicide rate

among today's youth is very high. Looking at the situation in Covid, the rate of depression has increased from children to adults. What is suicide? And what do we call suicide? A person ends his life. Suicide is when a person deliberately endangers his own life or endangers his own life, it is said to have committed suicide. Each person's tolerance level is more or less. If given to students in the classroom at some point, those students like it. Then he thinks. His stress increases. Therefore, she also guided the students in depth about the measures to prevent suicide as well as suicidal tendencies.

all those 16 students were interviewed. 5 students were selected through interviews. The selected students were given work in the library department from November 2022 to March 2023. According to the rules set by the university, according to the total working hours of the students, they were given a grant check of Rs. 40 per hour signed by the Principal and Student Development Officer.

2. Financial assistance to students from economically weaker sections

A total of 8 students' names from the college were recommended to Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhary North Maharashtra University Jalgaon to get financial assistance to the students from economically weaker sections of the college. The university provided a total of Rs.33,500 to 8 students. Students were given checks for their amounts.

3. Student Group Safety Accident Death Insurance Scheme

A total of 249 students of the college were insured under the Student Group Safety Accident Death Insurance Scheme Rs.20/- per student for a total of Rs.4980/-.

4. Student Medical Check-up

Medical Check-up for B.S.W. First year and M.S.W. first and second year students conducted by Medical Officer, Jawahar Medical Foundation, Annasaheb Chudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Morane, Dhule. A total of 192 students were medically examined. According to the medical authorities, no serious illness was detected in any student of the college.

5. World Tribal Day Program

On the occasion of Amrit Mahotsav of Freedom, World Tribal Day Program was organized by Student Development cell of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Social Work College, Morane, Dhule, on 9th August 2022 at 11:00 AM. on behalf of World Tribal Day program was chaired by the principal of the college Dr. Raghunath Mahajan and Keynote Speaker was Dr. Ashok Pawar (Senior Researcher and Former Director, Vasantrao Naik Study Centre, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad). the level of script, the tribal tribe has given a lot to the country. There are freedom fighters from the tribal tribes and the information about the changes should reach the society. Chief speaker Dr. Ashok Pawar said that tribals are wrongly called Naxalists, if they are not getting their rights, then today we need to introspect.

Hacking is done through a key locker. Be safe when visiting public cybercafes. After this, he said that a free cyber cell is being established by him in the college. Cyber security is provided by the teachers, students, and staff of the college in this cell. This cell works to prevent cyber crimes. If you need help in cyber matters, this cell helps.

Exhibition of posters: Exhibition of posters, online survey on child marriage between 9 am to 10 am. The students brought posters related to child marriage from Department of Women and Child Development, Dhule, besides, the students of MSW Part-II made their own posters based on the topic of child marriage, all of which were put up in the Vitthal Mandir area.

Online survey in case of child marriage: Between 10 am and 11 am some students conducted an online survey through google form by asking information about married women of Udane district Dhule village. A questionnaire of 37 questions based on the topic of child marriage was made and put in a Google form. A link to the Google Form was given to the students. Students asked questions to married women through the link provided and got their answers. A total of 59 women filled the online interview schedule.

Rally: At 11:00 am Secondary School, Tribal Ashram School, College teachers, and some students went to ashram schools, Zilla Parishad schools and requested them to give their students for the

rally. But as the mid-term examinations of the students in all the schools were going on, no students were available for the rally. So MSW in your college. A rally was organized from Udane village with the help of the students of Part 2 class. The rally was inaugurated by Mr. Bhatu Bagul, a member of Gram Panchayat of Udane village and the husband of Udane village deputy sarpanch by cutting the red ribbon and breaking coconuts. Chief Speaker Mr. Nandu Jadhav (District Coordinator - Child Marriage Eradication Project under UNICEF), Mr. Bhatu Bagul (Gram Panchayat Member, Udane), Mr. Nanabhau Wagh (Shiv Sena Taluka President) were present as chief guests. The introduction of the program was presented by Prof. Dr. Dilip Ghongde.

Chief Guest: Mr. Bhatu Bagul (Member- Gram Panchayat Udane):

Mr. Bhatu Bagul expressed his thoughts. In it, he said that colleges have organized a good programme. It is necessary to create awareness in the society to prevent the problem of child marriage. Child marriage used to take place but now its rate has reduced. Girls and boys should study more, not get married at a young age. The college should always organize the program.

Shri.Nanabhau Wagh (Shiv Sena Taluka President):

Mr. Nanabhau Wagh while guiding in his meditation also said that now the number of child marriages has reduced due to the fact that the parent class is well educated. Social work college has come and worked in our village since earlier. We have had a good relationship with the college for many years. A good program has been organized in the case of child marriage. Today in every house someone is educated so daughter or sister is not married at a young age. Earlier marriages were mostly done at a young age. I have also had a child marriage earlier but now in the village we do not allow child marriage. The law has made the age of marriage for a girl 18 and that of a boy 21. Nanabhau Wagh expressed the opinion that many problems arise due to child marriage.

Key Person Guidance: Mr. Nandu Jadhav (District Coordinator - UNICEF - Child Marriage Eradication Project Dhule and Jalgaon)

Chief speaker Mr. Nandu Jadhav, while giving guidance on child marriage eradication, said that Dhule district ranks third in terms of child marriage. Beed district is ranked first, Parbhani district is second and Dhule district is third. The Prevention of Child Marriage Act 2006 is

currently in force in the country, according to which the age of marriage for a girl is 18 years and that of a boy is 21 years. According to this law, Gram Sevak has been entrusted with the responsibility to prevent child marriage in rural areas. Anganwadi Sevika has also been given the responsibility along with them. While in urban areas Child Development Project Officers and Anganwadi Workers are given the responsibility to prevent child marriage. The government is in the mood to increase the age of marriage for girls.

We have made a recommendation to the Central Government that every gram panchayat should pass a resolution in the gram sabha regarding the eradication of child marriage so that there will be no child marriage in the village. This recommendation has been accepted by the Law Ministry. If the resolution is passed in the gram sabha, then all those who attend the gram sabha and sign the resolution will be responsible for preventing child marriage. If child marriage takes place after all this, then according to the law, all those who have signatures on the Gram Sabha resolution will be guilty. This was guided by Mr. Nandu Jadhav.

Presidential Conclusion:

The closing guidance of the program was given by Prof. Shyamsingh Valvi. In it, he said that Udane village and our college have been related for many years. Many dignitaries of the village have always supported the program of the college. Former Sarpanchs, present Gram Panchayat members, Mr. Subhash Shinde, Mr. Santosh Bagul, Subhash Bagul, Naval Patil, Prof. Vijay Patil have always helped in that. In 1929, the Child Marriage Prevention Act was the first to be passed in India regarding child marriage. After that in 2006 the Prevention of Child Marriage Act has been passed and now the government is looking to introduce a new law. Although the new law will come, it is the responsibility of the whole society to prevent child marriage in the society. Transformation does not happen suddenly, it takes years to wait. This opinion was expressed by Prof. Shyam Singh Valvi.

The program was moderated by student Nikam Twinkle. Mahale Savita, a student, thanked for the program. The program was attended by Dr. Dilip Ghongde, Dr. Farida Khan, Dr. Gopal Nimbalkar, Dr. Pramod Bhumbe, Prof. Meghavi Meshram, Prof. Preeti Vahane from the college. A total of 51 students of MSW Part II class were present. In this way, a special awareness camp on child marriage eradication was completed in one day.

Key note Speech: Prof. Dr. MahendraKumar Wadhe (SSVPS College of Aets and Commerce, Dhule)

Prof. Dr. MahendraKumar Wadhe said in his Key note speech that Colombia started to propose the idea of sustainable goals from 2011. Gradually many countries supported this idea. India's help in this regard was important. Through this effort, at the 2012 Rio+20 conference, all countries signed off on the concept of the Sustainable Development Goals as a guide for their collective progress beyond 2015. After this, the United Nations started discussing these goals at

both political and technical levels. Governments of all countries, non-governmental organizations, various global organizations, associations, industry world and other groups were heard.

These efforts resulted in a program that states what principles should be adopted for what should be achieved by 2030. Based on this, each country has to set targets for its country. A total of 169 such targets have been fixed. For example, poverty alleviation aims to eradicate extreme poverty globally. It also aims to lift at least 50% of the poor from all forms of poverty. The aim is to double the production and income of small farmers while considering the goal of eradicating hunger. In this way, measurable targets have been fixed for all the objectives.

Set your own national goals. The Spanish government is actively committed to creating this universal and transformative agenda. Spain's position was determined through a participatory process, which included academics, experts, and representatives of the national administration and autonomous communities.

Challenges such as poverty, hunger, education, and sustainable development can be addressed when people at the bottom have access to income opportunities, tools, and institutional support to do business, equal education, better working conditions, and green technology. When informal enterprises, micro and small enterprises are empowered, they bring about positive change, thereby achieving sustainable development. Many NGOs work on sustainable development targets such as poverty, hunger, quality education, and decent work. The newly emerging discourses of sustainable development, human rights, environmentalism, and feminism appear to be at the center of many of these efforts. NGOs seem to focus on intervening in society on behalf of the exploited and underprivileged groups using their knowledge, training, and skills. Many NGOs are seen simultaneously trying to reach policymakers and organizations working at the village level through coordination and networking. Due to the work of NGOs, there is a progressive change in some government policies. Mr. Kushavart Patil opined that sustainable development can be done with the initiative of a voluntary organization.

In it, he said that sustainable development means such development, through which the needs of the present generation can be met without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs. Eternal means something that lasts forever. The word development has some limited concepts in our heads. It is not enough to say that there is economic growth or development. Individual, family and social well-being depends on some other factors which are different from economic development. Sustainable development is bigger than economic development. A short-lived development may not last long. It is necessary to fulfill the basic needs of man. But at the same time, in sustainable development, it is equally important that the future generation meet their needs (water resources, air quality) without depleting natural resources. From Delhi to UNO, the important question is why the need to consider the concept of sustainable development arose. Since the beginning of time, human beings have adopted ways to make their lives happy.

Session IV - Time: 2:30 PM

Subject: Environmental Laws for Sustainable Development

Resource person: Prof.Dr. Sandesh Shegaonkar (Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Memorial Law College, Dhule)

In the fourth session of the webinar, Dr. Sandesh Shegaonkar gave the following guidance on environmental laws for sustainable development.

In the year 1992, a conference on environment and development was held in Rio de Janeiro by the United Nations. At that conference, a new division under the United Nations umbrella, the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), was established. It was a decision taken jointly by the member countries of the United Nations, and since 1995 the representatives of the countries involved in this decision started meeting every year. The purpose of these annual conferences is to review the current state of global climate change, and the efforts being made to address it. The Kyoto Conference of 1997 was of historic importance due to the agreement it reached. Global climate change and the resulting global warming are completely manmade, so if there is an imbalance on Earth, mankind alone will be responsible for it. This warming is mainly due to the greenhouse effect. There is a need for radical efforts at the global level to prevent global warming. The Kyoto Protocol is an important step in that effort. The second phase of the agreement has been approved until 2020.

The Forest Act, of 1927, a pre-independence forest act, was amended to freeze the rights of farmers occupying forests and gave the forest officers very limited powers in the draft amendment bill. The Wildlife (Protection) Act, of 1972 protects wild animals, birds, and plants and matters connected or incidental to them to ensure the ecological and ecological security of the country.

Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974: This Act is important to prevent water pollution. According to this law, everyone must have access to clean water for drinking and consumption. The Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, of 1974 was enacted to prevent water pollution by industrial, agricultural, and domestic effluents.

Forest Conservation Act 1980: This Act provides for the protection of forests and matters related to the habitat of many animals. The purpose of the Forest (Conservation) Act was to ensure the protection and conservation of trees. So that by supporting wildlife, we can save the habitat of many animals and check the deforestation and degradation of forest resources. Protection and Improvement of Environment and Protection of Forests and Wildlife - The State shall endeavor to protect and improve the environment as well as protect the forests and wildlife of the country. Every citizen of India has to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, and wildlife as well as to have compassion for living creatures.

Environment Protection Act, 1986: According to Section 5 of the Environment Protection Act, 1986, the central government can direct the closure of any industrial or business group if any

environment is harmed in its daily activities. Under Section 15 of the Act, if any person fails to comply with the provisions of the Act and the instructions regarding environmental protection, the said person or the representative of the industry group shall be liable to imprisonment for five years and to pay a fine of up to one lakh. Special courts deal with cases related to the environment. A 'National Green Tribunal' has been set up for speedy and effective adjudication.

The decision of the Tribunal can be directly appealed to the Supreme Court. Failure to comply with the orders of this tribunal may result in heavy fines. Since the establishment of the National Green Tribunal, no other court in India has jurisdiction to entertain or entertain any case related to the environment. Such guidance was given by Dr. Shegaonkar. He then guided the court on various environmental judgments.

Session V - Time: 3:30 PM

Topic: Challenges to Sustainable Development

Instrument Person: Prof. Gautam Sadavarte (BP Arts, SMA Science, KKC College of Commerce, Chalisgaon)

In the fifth session of the webinar, Prof. Gautam Sadavarte guided through PPT on the topic of challenges facing sustainable development.

There are many challenges facing sustainable development in India. While many of these problems stem from the insensitive use of natural resources, government accountability in solving serious problems is also diminishing. This degradation of the environment has a direct impact on the lives of individuals, affecting longevity, which in turn affects the entire development process. Degraded soils, shrinking aquifers, shrinking forests, deteriorating urban environments, and destroyed ecosystems can lead to poor living standards and quality of life in the future. The challenges are both natural and man-made.

Deforestation, threats to biodiversity, effects of climate change, rising pollution levels, groundwater depletion and pollution, poor health, literacy rates, and environmental sustainability lead to water contamination and safe drinking water. Sir guided like this.

Trees are very important for the environment. We must stop the felling of trees. Today, the environment is under threat due to deforestation, increasing pollution, and climate change. Preference is given to plastic bags instead of cloth. As a result, instead of reducing the intensity of environmental change, it is becoming more intense day by day. Today the world has not even thought about what we have lost while achieving development and progress. In the name of development for communication, the trees along the roads were slaughtered on a large scale.

Humans cut down trees and built cement houses for shelter. The cutting of trees continues even today. Overall, inexcusable deforestation has become a concern today.

Today, the water storage on the ground has decreased. The water is not decreasing automatically but due to the cutting down of trees by humans, the water reserves are decreasing. Water conservation is the need of the hour. For that, we should save water. Water should be used only as needed, water should not be wasted. March 3 is World Wildlife Day. Many days are celebrated for the protection and conservation of the environment. Shri. Premkumar Ahire did.

Mr. Prem Kumar Ahire is the Maharashtra President of Nisarga Mitra Samiti. The Nisarga Mitra Committee has prepared the mandate of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. This order was given by the sarpanch of War Village and the principal of the college.

Subject: Soil Conservation and Environment

Resource Person: Mr. Abasaheb Santoshrao Patil (State General Secretary, Nisarga Mitra Samiti)

Mr. Abasaheb Santoshrao Patil guided that the most important but equally neglected subject in the world is land i.e. soil. According to environmentalists, due to increasing urbanization and increasing population day by day, we are said to have destroyed the topsoil over the last few years. It is a fact that without soil, plants will not be able to sustain themselves. In the coming times, maximum forest protection, and water storage should be created in large quantities. It is also important to maintain the existing water reserves in a pure form and avoid the use of non-degradable materials like plastic. Otherwise, it is impossible to maintain the balance of the environment no matter how hard we try. For this, everyone has to stop cutting trees and use minimum water. Also, we have to live a plastic-free life.

Deforestation should be banned. Tree plantation should be given special emphasis. Soil erosion can be prevented by constructing embankments on sloping land. Emphasis should be placed on protecting soil from erosion during construction and mining. The field should be plowed against the slope.

The adoption of crop rotation techniques should be increased to make the soil valuable in nutrients.

Presidential Conclusion:

College Principal Dr. Raghunath Mahajan presided over the program. In the presidential guidance, Dr. Raghunath Mahajan said that water, land, and forests should be protected and conserved for the environment. Air pollution, climate change and natural disasters, microbial diseases, and water quality can invite serious health problems. Environmental pollutants and industrial wastes can cause respiratory diseases like asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, bronchitis, heart disease, irregular heartbeat, respiratory failure, depression, stroke, wheezing, cough, and shortness of breath. The number of deaths due to pollution has also increased in recent years. Pollution also increases eye and skin problems.

Unsafe drinking water and unsanitary conditions lead to diarrhea, cholera, meningitis, and gastritis.

It is necessary to maintain a healthy environment for people to live longer and improve their quality of life.

Subject: Water Resources and Environment

Resource Person: Hon. Dr. Sanjay Dhodere (Abhay Women's College, Dhule)

Mr. Dr. Sanjay Dhodare provided subject-wise guidance on water resources and the environment. In it, he said that it is said that there is life because of water. People are the biggest wealth in this country. If these people come together and save water, which is the greatest wealth of nature, then the face of this country will change. 

The following team runs the Centre:



A workshop on Social Work Profession Opportunities and Skill Development was organized on 6th and 7th February 2022. In this workshop, students were guided on writing skills, NGO registration and NGO management. 27 students participated in this.

On February 16, 2023, the presentation of the six-monthly report of the research students enrolled in the Research and Training Center was held. 8 research students presented their research reports.
